






Foreign cycling destinations beloved by German cycletourists







- Network of cycle routes: 370 km
- Integrated card for PT (train) and rent-a-bike network
- plan for rest areas

Bicicard: rent + public transport in one ticket




Survey by the Province of Trento (2010)

Aimed at estimating the economic value of the 4 most used cycle paths (daytrips + overnight trips):

- Valle dell'Adige (Etsch)	€1 mln
- Garda Lake	€75 mln (€1.7 overnight)
- Valsugana (link to Veneto)	€7 mln
- Val di Sole	€2 mln
Total	€85 mln

ITINERARI:



1000 km of cycle routes signposted in 2013:

- 7 daytrips/excursions routes
- 4 overnight routes

Selected considering figures given by specialized TO (Italian and foreign):

- 6.000 Garda lake to Venice
- 2.000 Dolomites to Venice

- < 2.000 Adriatic coast

Italian bureaucracy

It is difficult and expensive to obtain credit

Labour laws not adequate

Transport laws not adequate

Italian cycling infrastructures? No comment!

Historical overview of cycling infrastructures development

Since 1980s

Some local authorities started investing to plan and build cycling infrastructures

1989

FIAB was founded as an umbrella organization for local cycling groups. It shaped its role as national advocacy to coordinate the growing of local planning and infrastructure development

1998

Law 366/98 on how to fund cycling infrastructure

(Norme per il finanziamento della mobilità ciclistica)

followed by a decree on rules to apply the law (Decreto min. 557/99 Regolamento recante norme per la definizione delle caratteristiche tecniche delle piste ciclabili)

Influenced by the culture of devolution, stated that Regions will develop planning and funding of projects proposed by local authorities

928 projects presented

€ 476 million invested

Veneto: 196 project (€ 90 million)

Lombardy: 116 projects

Tuscany: 95 projects

2000

FIAB presented a first plan of a national cycle network called Bicitalia and integrated in EuroVelo

2002

Feasability study of a national cycle network commissioned to FIAB by the Ministry of the Environment

FIAB presented a national signposting proposals and continue to push Regions to plan cycle networks and to integrate them in a national perspective




Fig 3: Cartello "turistico" con itinerari ricavato da modifiche delle figure 360 - 363 art 136 DPR 495/92 adatto anche per viabilità ordinaria

Last 10 years

Some Regions and local authorities engaged in

- approving regional laws for cycling
- planning of regional networks
- building infrastructures with own and EU funds
- developing services for cyclists

Last 2 years (2 governments)

Cycling renaissance:

**Movement Save the Cyclists >SIC, critical mass
“Etats Généraux” in 2012, Reggio Emilia**

Work in progress:



Rome, Parliament, February 2014

Relevant strong political action at national level:

- all party Parliament group for cycling (70), coordinated by former mobility mayor of Reggio Emilia
- Started a cycle-friendly reform of the Highway Code
- A draft proposal of a General framework law on cycling (Legge quadro per la mobilità ciclistica) including a part on the National Cycle Network

On behalf of the Ministry of Environment FIAB started

- an official partnership with Regional authorities to define a national network of cycle routes
- collecting data on ‘good quality’ (greenways) existing infrastructures (a sort of a census).
Work in progress...

3.000 km sofar, of which:
800 km of rail-trails
(400 km are Bicitalia
and 80 km are EuroVelo)
