


Greenways

> Communication routes reserved exclusively for non-motorized journeys, developed in an integrated manner which enhances both the environment and quality of life of the surrounding area. These routes should meet satisfactory standards of width, gradient, and surface condition to ensure that they are both user-friendly and low -risk for users of all abilities. In this respect, canal towpaths and disused railway lines are a highly suitable resource for the development of greenways».

Lille Declaration, 12 September 2000



Sustainable mobility

Greenways: Connected, continuous network, accessible in public transport (specially by train)





A dense network of bike paths of over 1,200 kilometers connecting greenways, waterways and other cycle routes, to favour the transition to active daily mobility in a safe way, in one of the largest conurbation in Europe.

Greenways: safe connectivity, with attractions and

villages nearby

> With the main attractions nearby (natural as e.g. N2000, cultural and natural UNESCO sites and other heritage assets), small villages and surrounding areas;

Cyklostezka Sázava. Follows the river Sázava and connects towns of Přibyslav and Sázava; along connecting cycle route 19 also UNESCO site Pilgrimage Church of St John of Nepomuk in Žďár n.S.

The greenway uses 120 years old railway Havlíčkův Brod – Žďár n. S.



Intermodality & Combined travel (bicycle + train

/boat /buses)

➤ to facilitate intermodality, removing obstacles to favour cycle routes, their services and attractions, for tourists and local people;





Counters permit better understanding and directing of visitor flows, and support the planning for future marketing and investments along and in the vicinity of the Vennbahn.










Tourism services for visitors and residents alike



European Parliament's request to the European Commission

- **√Financial support to EuroVelo to promote cycle tourism in Europe.**

European Declaration on Cycling

European Commission, recognises cycling as a sustainable, accessible and inclusive, affordable and healthy means of transport, with strong added value for the EU economy.

European Parliament resolution of 16 February 2023 on developing an EU cycling strategy (2022/2909(RSP)
