# PORTUGUESE TRAILS | THE PROCESS

**Coordination:** Turismo de Portugal in collaboration with public partners (ex. IP Património) and tourist companies

Common focus on **Nature Tourism:** Cycling & Walking routes to promote experiences across the country, with carbon-free mobility

Aligned with national and regional tourism strategies

- 39 routes covering 20,000 km all over the country(5 Ecopistas /Greenways)
- 300+ tourist SMEs involved
- "100% Responsible Programs" initiative: 151 Cycling &
   Walking programs (50% of total)

- Financing programs to develop and improve routes and facilities
- Cycling & Walking routes contribute to local business growth, increase tourist demand and improve residents' satisfaction
- International recognition of Portugal as a destination for sustainable experiences (Cycling & Walking)









- **Greenways** Since June 2022, **Turismo de Portugal** and IP Património have been actively promoting the **Portugal's Greeways Network**
- **Goals:** Enhance the value of sustainable mobility routes by:
- Sharing best practices among municipalities and intermunicipal communities
- Organizing technical meetings to foster collaboration and strategic planning
- Engaging residents and tourists through promotional and educational activities
- Promote environmental stewardship and regional growth through soft mobility solutions

### **Environmental Sustainability**

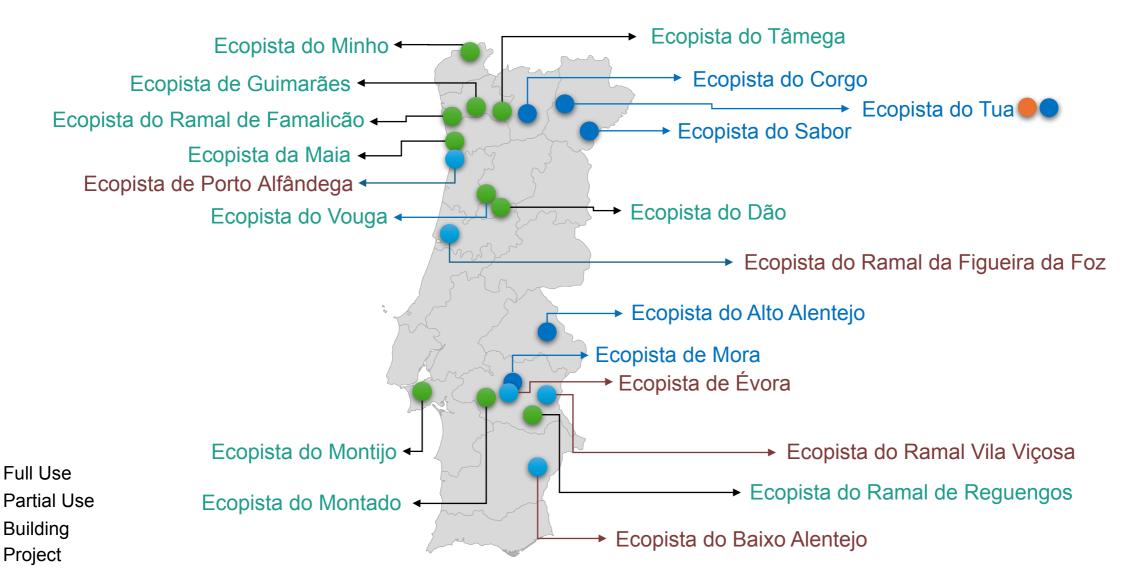
Gentle mobility on Greeways reduces ecological footprint and supports transport decarbonization and environmental preservation
